# EBU Technical Recommendation R81-2000 Recommended minimum information and preferred format for labels on television recordings for the international exchange of programmes

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#### **Keywords:** Video recording - General

The EBU *recommends* the following procedure for the labeling of video tapes and other broadcast media used for the international exchange of television programmes.

The labeling should consist of three elements:

- A tape or spool number label with bar-code, identifying the spool uniquely, but not containing any programme information.
- A programme label identifying the programme and the most important features of the recording.
- A record report, containing full details of the technical parameters of the recording.

#### 1. Spool number label

The spool label is generated by the facility which first uses the blank stock and may be affixed before any recording is made as a means of stock control. The label should conform to the requirements of the International Broadcast Tape Number (IBTN) scheme [1]. The bar-code form of the label may be read by any organization participating in the IBTN scheme. The label can also be read normally.




Fig. 1 - Examples of cassette and spool labels

Fig. 1 shows examples of spool labels for cassettes and open reel tapes.

Two identical spool number labels are needed: one for the shipping container and one for the spool or cassette itself, so as to ensure that the cassette can reliably be replaced in the correct container.

It is recommended that the cassette label is not fixed to the front face of the cassette since this space may be used for machine-specific labels used with automatic-loading machines.

#### 2. Programme label

As the space available on a tape or cassette box is limited, technical information on the programme label is restricted to the most basic parameters.

Fig. 2a shows an example of a programme label which is suitable for an Amaray style case for a small Betacam cassette. The design may be scaled as appropriate for use on other cassette formats and sizes.

Fig. 2b shows an example of a programme label for use on an open-reel format.

Completed examples of these labels are given in the Appendix.

The programme label is primarily intended for the shipping container, although some EBU Members also use a programme title label on the cassette itself.

### 3. Record report

A record report containing details of the recording should be included with the recording. An example of a record report is given in Fig. 3. A similar report form can also be used to:

- state preferences/requirements for exchange;
- provide advance information by post/fax.

A completed example of a report form is shown in the Appendix.

The EBU is aware that concern has been expressed about the possibility that the chemicals in some paper used for record reports may affect the tape and the life of the recording in storage. The EBU is currently investigating the matter in depth; in the meantime, it may be advisable in long-term archives to store the paper record report in a separate wallet on the outside of the tape case.
